A Vision for Wilmot's Future: Investing in Our Students and Community

As a valued member of the Wilmot Union High School community, your voice matters. On April 1, 2025, you'll have the opportunity to shape the future of our school and our community by voting in a crucial referendum. This isn't just about bricks and mortar; it's about investing in our students, enhancing their safety, and providing them with the modern learning environments they deserve.

What is the Referendum?

The Wilmot Union High School District is seeking voter approval for a \$22,900,000 community facility bond referendum. These funds will be dedicated to high-priority projects that address critical building needs that cannot be covered by our annual operating budget.

Why Now?

The timing of this referendum is strategic. This year, we made our final payment on existing debt. This means that if the referendum is approved, there will be no increase to the tax mill rate. In fact, taxpayers will see a net decrease in their taxes. Waiting any longer would mean missing this opportunity and potentially facing a property tax increase if we move forward with these vital projects at a later time.

What Will the Referendum Fund?

This referendum focuses on three key areas:

- Modernizing Learning Environments: This includes expanding the Tech Ed Metals Shop to accommodate growing student interest, upgrading classroom technology to enhance instruction, and renovating the Culinary and Home Economics Labs.
- Enhancing Safety and Security: The safety of our students and staff is paramount. The referendum will fund upgrades to the main entrance to improve security, expand the fire protection system, and install updated security cameras throughout the school.
- **Upgrading Building Infrastructure**: Our school's infrastructure needs attention. The referendum will address critical roof repairs, HVAC and electrical system updates, athletic facilities upgrades, and improvements to sidewalks and parking lots to ensure a safe and functional learning environment.

Additional projects in each area are also included.

A Collaborative Approach

This referendum is the result of careful planning and community input. We commissioned Nexus Solutions to conduct a comprehensive facility assessment and surveyed the community to understand our educational priorities. The proposed projects reflect the needs and desires of our students, staff, and community members.

Violence Prevention and Threat Assessment

Our school follows the *Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Guidelines* (*CSTAG*) to prevent violence and address potential threats effectively. This evidence-based approach helps us assess and manage situations before they escalate, ensuring a safer school environment for everyone.

Collaboration with County Resources and Mental Health Support

We work closely with local county resources and organizations like **Care Solace** https://caresolace.com/site/wilmot to provide mental health support for students and staff. If you or someone you know is struggling, please reach out for help. We are committed to fostering a community where mental health is prioritized.

School Resource Officer (SRO) on Duty

Our dedicated *School Resource Officer (SRO)* is on campus to provide security, build positive relationships with students, and serve as a resource for safety education and crisis response.

Reunification Plan in Case of Emergencies

In the event of an emergency requiring evacuation or relocation, we have a *Reunification Plan* in place to ensure students are safely returned to their families.

Standard Response Protocol (SRP)

We follow the *Standard Response Protocol (SRP)* developed by the I Love U Guys Foundation. This protocol standardizes our response to incidents such as lockdowns, evacuations, and shelter-in-place situations. More information on SRP can be found **here**.




