** THE GUIDANCE ON THE COVID-19 SYMPTOM FLOWCHART IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE BASED ON CURRENT RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CDC, DHS AND THE KENOSHA COUNTY DIVISION OF HEALTH**

Staff are asked to evaluate themselves daily for symptoms of COVID-19. Please refer to the COVID-19 Symptom Flowchart for specific guidance based on symptoms.

HIGH-RISK Symptoms: LOW-RISK Symptoms: New cough, difficulty breathing, loss of taste or smell, fever (> 100.4°F) Chills, congestion/runny nose, nausea/vomiting, diarrhea, sore throat, headache, body aches, fatigue

- I have NO EXPOSURE to COVID-19 & 1 low-risk symptom
 - Put your time in Skyward normal sick time procedure, no other contacts with nurse or principal needed.
 - I have NO EXPOSURE to COVID-19 & 2 low-risk symptoms or 1 high-risk symptom
 - Contact school nurse for further guidance (days out of work will be depend on treatment plan - see <u>Home Screening Tool Staff</u>)
 - Contact principal to determine teaching plan
 - Put time in Skyward
 - If absence will be for several days, contact HR
- I have tested positive for COVID-19
 - Contact school nurse to go over contact tracing information, symptom onset and date of return
 - Everyone, regardless of vaccination status
 - Stay home for 5 days
 - If you no have symptoms <u>or</u> your symptoms are resolving, you can return to work
 - If you have a fever, continue to stay home until your fever resolves
 - Continue to wear a mask while around other for 5 additional days (N95 or KN95 mask required while at Wilmot)
 - Contact principal to determine teaching plan
 - Put time in Skyward
 - Contact HR
- I have recently been in close contact (within 6 feet for greater that 15 minutes) with a person who has been diagnosed with COVID-19
 - If you are fully vaccinated within the past 6 months with Moderna or Pfizer or J&J within the past 2 months, or received a booster dose, or had a lab based positive confirmatory or antigen test within 90 days of the exposure you do not need to be quarantined. You should :
 - Wear a mask around others for 10 days from last exposure
 - Test on day 5 after exposure, if possible.
 - If symptoms occur, individuals should immediately quarantine until a negative test confirms symptoms are not attributable to COVID-19.
 - If you are NOT vaccinated, partially vaccinated, or vaccinated more than 6 months ago with Moderna or Pfizer or J&J more than 2 months ago and not boosted, or had a lab based positive confirmatory or antigen test more than 90 days from the exposure:
 - Quarantine for 5 days from last exposure with positive case
 - Monitor for symptoms for 10 days
 - Test on day 5 after exposure, if possible.

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- Continue to wear a well-fitting mask around others for 5 additional days.
- If symptoms occur, individuals should immediately quarantine until a negative test confirms symptoms are not attributable to COVID-19.

• Definition of fully vaccinated

 A person is fully vaccinated 14 days after they have completed either 2 doses of a mRNA vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) or a single dose of a viral vector vaccine (J&J).

• Definition of Fully boosted

- A person is fully boosted immediately after receiving a booster dose of an mRNA or viral vector vaccine.
- Contact principal to determine teaching plan
 - Put time in Skyward
 - Contact HR

If you need to leave work, the following procedure must be followed:

- 1. Staff will isolate themselves from others as soon as possible (apply mask if not already wearing).
- 2. Staff will report illness to the school nurse.
- 3. Staff will report illness to their supervisor.
- 4. Staff will contact the appropriate administrative assistant to procure a substitute if needed.
