### OPERATIONAL REFERENDUM

### **Hello Wilmot!**

The Wilmot Union High School Board of Education has placed a three-year, non-recurring Operational Referendum on the February, 20, 2024, ballot. The request is for \$2,000,000 in 2024-25, \$2,500,000 in 2025-26, and \$3,000,000 in 2026-27.

If approved, the funds will be used to hire back some of the positions that were cut after the failed April, 2023 referendum, complete deferred maintenance projects, provide updates to security, and begin to build the fund balance so we can afford routine maintenance in the future.

### Why Now?

The District's dire financial situation was caused by several years of underfunding by the state of WI, declining enrollment, and unprecedented inflation. This year, the District saved over \$1,300,000 with staff cuts and is still running a small budget deficit that's expected to grow without additional staff and programming cuts in the future.

Ongoing, basic expenses needed to run the school are surpassing the revenue allowed through the state revenue limit.

### Protocol for calling a student out of school:

1) Contact the attendance office either by phone or email. Please state the reason for the absence.

Call (262) 862-2351 & press 1 or email attendance@wilmoths.k12.wi.us.

2) Each absence will count towards 1 of the 10 days that the state allows a student to be excused. **This will include any illnesses.** If the proper documentation is provided, such as a doctor's note, the absence will not count towards the state allowed 10 parental excused absences.

A referral and letter will be sent home for notification purposes after the 5th and 10th parental excused absence.

Absences after the 10th parental excused absence will be considered truant.

Wisconsin State Statute 118.15 (3) (c) indicates a child may <u>not</u> be excused for more than 10 days in a school year.

### **SEXTORTION - ice.gov**

## What is it and what can parents do to help prevent and stop it?

Not long ago, making prank calls was the worst trouble a group of teens could get into with a telephone.

But today, predators use phones to stalk and blackmail teens on social media and dating apps. Sextortion — the act of threatening to share nude or explicit images — is more common than you may think, and cases affecting young children, teens and adults have increased exponentially in the past two years. In fact, Homeland Security Investigations received over 3,000 sextortion tips in fiscal year 2022.

One current sextortion trend targets boys between 14 and 17 years old. Adult predators pretending to be young girls feign romantic interest in the boys on gaming platforms, apps and social media sites.

It starts simply enough: A teen responds to an online request to expose parts of their body on a webcam or send a nude photo to a new online "friend." The next thing the teen knows, their new friend threatens to expose them by publicizing the photos — unless they pose for more explicit photos or send money.

In some schemes, adult predators deceive and manipulate young males into engaging in explicit activity over video, which the predator secretly records. The predator then reveals that they've made the recording and threatens to post clips online if the victim doesn't pay up.

This terrifying and dehumanizing violation feeds on victims' shame. The emotional results for victims — especially kids — is devastating. Feeling embarrassed, hopeless and isolated, many of these teens have nowhere to turn. Some even go so far as to take their own lives without knowing that help is available.

### **Traditional Sextortion versus Financial Sextortion**

Traditional sextortion occurs when a victim is threatened or blackmailed into providing more sexual imagery; the predator threatens to share their nude or sexual images with the public. Financial sextortion occurs when a predator demands money or gift cards in exchange for keeping their sexual images private.

In a recent analysis by the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children, or NCMEC, financial sextortion is on the rise. Currently, as many as 79% of predators seek money rather than additional sexual imagery. NCMEC is one of HSI's most valued partners in the fight against sextortion. HSI also collaborates with other law enforcement partners to bring sextortionists to justice.



### <u>Did you know?</u>

- Valentine, who was a priest in third century Rome, defied Emperor Claudius II's ban on marriage (he thought it distracted young soldiers), illegally marrying couples in the spirit of love until he was caught and sentenced to death.
- The oldest record of a valentine being sent, according to <u>History.com</u>, was a poem written by a French medieval duke named Charles to his wife in 1415. Charles penned this sweet note to his lover while he was imprisoned in the Tower of London at just 21 years old. One of the lines in the poem? "I am already sick of love, My very gentle Valentine." Swoon!
- ♥Giving red roses may be an obvious romantic gesture today, but it wasn't until the late 17th century that giving flowers became a popular custom. In fact, the practice <u>can be traced back</u> to when King Charles II of Sweden learned the "language of flowers" which pairs different flowers with specific meanings on a trip to Persia, and subsequently introduced the tradition to Europe. The act of giving flowers then became a popular trend during the Victorian Era including on Valentine's Day with red roses symbolizing deep love.
- According to the <u>National Retail Foundation</u>, Americans spent nearly \$26 billion on Valentine's Day gifts in 2023! People were also expected to spend an average of approximately \$193 for Valentine's Day.
- Many Latin American countries know the holiday as "El Día De Los Enamorados" (Day of Lovers) or "Día Del Amor y La Amistad" (Day of Love and Friendship). Though couples exchange flowers and chocolate on this day, the holiday's focus is also directed at showing gratitude to friends.
- In Japan, it's customary for just the women to give confections to the men in their lives, with the quality of the chocolate indicating their true feelings, according to <u>Fortune</u>. On March 14, exactly a month later, the men repay the favor by celebrating the increasingly popular "White Day."



### Why is leap day every four years?

• The reason there are leap days, and years, is because of the Earth's orbit. The amount of days it takes for the Earth to complete a full revolution around the Sun is not a whole number. The 365 days we experience is actually 365.2422 days, National Geographic reports. Getting rid of 0.2422 days adds up. The fraction allows the seasons to correctly line up each year. If it was forgotten, the months during which we normally experience each seasons would shift, according to National Geographic. This would impact other aspects of life, such as the growing and harvesting of crops. This is why leap years exist. When added, four 0.2422 days roughly equal one full day. Feb. 29 is added to the calendar of most years that are divisible by four, including 2024.

### During leap years, January, April, and July all start on the same day.

• Every leap year, these months all start on the same day. In 2024 they'll all start on a Monday. And, in 2020, they all began on a Wednesday, as you can see by looking at this <u>calendar</u>.

### Tradition says it's okay for women to propose to men on the 29th of February!

• This stems back to 1582, when Pope Gregory XIII created the Gregorian calendar. The idea of adding an extra day every four years seemed so ridiculous to many that a British play joked it would be a day when women should trade their dresses for 'breeches' and act like men. The play was a satire, but it may have inspired some early feminists as by the 1700s, women were using leap days to propose to men. The tradition peaked in the early 1900s and continues to this day in the UK. Some retailers even offer discounts to women planning to pop the question.
