ACADEMICS:

- STAR Testing: On Wednesday, February 9, and Wednesday, February 16, students in grades 9

 11 will be taking their Star Math Test and Star Reading Test. The Star Tests are short tests that provide teachers with learning data in math and reading. Star tests are computer-adaptive, which means they adjust to each answer your child provides. To access previous student reports, log into Skyward and click on your student's information tab and then their profile tab. All previous reports will display.
- ACP Course Guide: The full 2022-2023 Academic & Career Planning (ACP) Guide can be found <u>HERE</u>. We also recently launched an <u>ACP module</u> on our website which allows students and families another way to explore the many course offerings available at Wilmot Union High School. Use <u>this document</u> to help navigate the new ACP module.



- **Course Selection:** 9th-11th grade students will begin their 22-23 course selection process in homerooms beginning the week of 1/24/22. We encourage you to talk with your student about this process and their selections. Students will meet individually with their counselors starting in February to confirm their course selections. Students will have until June 1st to let their counselor know of any schedule change requests for the 22-23 school year. You can preview a short tutorial on the course selection process and the new ACP Module <u>HERE</u>.
- Work-Based Learning: Sophomores and Juniors did you know that you can receive 0.5 up to 2.0 credits for work experience through a single semester, a full year, or up to two years? You may also be able to include summer work hours for credit if scheduled soon enough. Learn more about our <u>Youth Apprenticeship Program</u> and other <u>Work-Based Learning</u> options from your school counselor, or by contacting <u>Mr. Strother</u>.
- Gateway Technical College High School Academies: Gateway will be offering eight High School Academies in the 2022-2023 school year. High school students who participate in the high school academy will earn an ACT 59/CTE Incentive credential from Gateway Technical College and/or will complete 15-20% of their Associate's Degree before they graduate from high school. Additional information is available online at gtc.edu/earn-credit under High School Academies. There will be an information session for Students & Parents on Tuesday, February 8, from 5:30 pm-6:30 pm via Zoom. Forms & applications are due on May 15 to the High School Partnerships Team at dualcredit@gtc.edu. Priority will be given to students who turn in a form by March 1. See <u>Mr. Strother</u> for additional details.
- Second Semester Gradebook Information: For the second semester, teachers will be making two changes to their gradebooks.
 - The first change will apply to any student who has an *extended excused absence*. If a student has an extended excused absence and misses a summative assessment, the missed summative assessment grade will be marked as an incomplete, "I". The incomplete grade will change both the term and semester grades to incompletes. *If a student does not complete the summative assessment within the appropriate time frame, the "I" may switch to a zero, which could impact the overall grade.*
 - The second change will apply to any *missing work* students may have that can still be completed for credit. Any missing work students have that can still be turned in will be marked with *[V]* [checkmark] under the "Missing" column in Skyward to show that the student is missing the work and that it can still be turned in for credit.
 - Please contact your student's teacher or counselor if you have a question or concern about a specific grade.
- Quarantined Students: If a student is quarantined this year, parents/guardians can expect the following process to be followed:
 - An Associate Principal will call families with the next steps.



- The student's counselor will email all of the teachers and include the student & parent(s)/guardian(s) on the email to indicate the length of absence. This email is to ensure that all parties have each other's contact information to help the student continue to engage in school remotely.
- Students will be required to complete a daily check-in form emailed each day of quarantine from Ms. Cates. Ms. Cates will help to facilitate any communication and/or connections that students may need with their teachers. If a student does not complete the form for two consecutive school days, someone from Wilmot Union High School will reach out to help problem-solve.
- Students will need to check the Google Classroom assigned to each of their courses on a daily basis for updates, assignments, and class resources. They should contact the teacher directly with specific questions. For information on Google classroom and setting up a guardian summary click <u>HERE</u>.
- Students who are returning from quarantine may be entered into a guided study hall. When their make-up work from quarantine is complete, they will return to their regular study hall.

Parents & Guardians can expect to see communication from their student's courselor next week with additional course selection information.

- ACT Prep Class: This is a reminder to all Juniors that the next ACT Prep class will be starting in January. This class prepares students for the Statewide ACT test on March 8, 2022, which all Juniors are required to take. Classes start on Monday, January 24 and the cost is \$165. If your student would like to take the ASVAB test, please have them complete the ASVAB Registration Form that was emailed to them by Tuesday, February 1. As the date gets closer you will receive more information regarding the testing room location and details.
