

FEBRUARY 18, 2022 GENERAL UPDATES/REMINDERS:

- Superintendent Search: Thank you to everyone who took part in our stakeholder input sessions this week. We realize not everyone's schedule allows attendance at one of those meetings. You can still provide input by answering this quick Stakeholder Survey. We appreciate our district families and the community's support and input as we seek a candidate that will continue our District's successes into the future. The consultants from McPherson & Jacobson will host one more session for our support staff on February 22. - Office Hours: Please note that all of the WUHS Offices will open at 9:00 am on Tuesday, February 22, due to a meeting. Normal office hours will resume on Wednesday, February 23.
- **Report Cards:** Semester 1 Report Cards have been posted in Skyward Family Access under the Student Record Portfolio tab.

ACADEMICS:

- Earn College Credit in High School: Students, please don't forget that the deadline for Start College Now (Technical Schools) and Early College Credit Program (4-year Universities) is March 1st for the Fall 2022 semester. Juniors-Only ACT Day: Wilmot Union High School will be administering the ACT plus Writing examination on March 8, 2022. This test is state-mandated for all 11th-grade students. The school day for Juniors on March 8 will run from 7:30 am until 12:15 pm with our doors opening at 7:00 am. More information about our ACT testing day will be communicated to our Juniors and their families in the coming weeks via Skyward email and the US Postal Service. Attendance of Juniors on March 8th is essential. There is no school for 9th, 10th, or 12th-grade students on this day.

Please note that any Juniors with **ACT accommodations** WILL NOT have the same testing timeframe as stated above. They will need to report on March 8th to begin testing at 7:30 am, but they will test later than 12:15 pm. *You will receive a mailing that includes your student's specific schedule according to their accommodations.* If you have any questions about your student's accommodations, please contact Alana Jefferies at jefferiesa@wilmoths.k12.wi.us or (262) 862-2351 ext 307.

- Induction to Teaching Program: Wilmot appreciates the partnership with all of our K-8 schools to help our students learn and grow to prepare for careers beyond high school. This year, we have partnered with Wheatland, Riverview, Lakewood, and our Wilmot special ed program, who have all opened their doors to our Teaching Practicum students this semester. Our practicum students spend three days a week getting hands-on experience in classrooms and getting a real taste for what teaching is all about. We greatly appreciate their help in allowing our students this amazing opportunity!
- ACP Course Guide: The full 2022-2023 Academic & Career Planning (ACP) Guide can be found HERE. We also recently launched an ACP module on our website which allows students and families another way to explore the many course offerings available at Wilmot Union High School. Use this document to help navigate the new ACP module.
- Course Selection: 9th-11th grade students have begun the 2022-2023 school year course selection process. We encourage you to talk with your student about this process and their selections. Students will meet individually with their counselors to confirm their course selections. Students will have until June 1st to let their counselor know of any schedule change requests for the 22-23 school year. - Work-Based Learning: Sophomores and Juniors did you know that you can receive 0.5 up to 2.0 credits for work experience through a single semester, a full year, or up to two years? You may also be able to include summer work hours for credit if scheduled soon enough. - Quarantined Students: If a student is quarantined this year, parents/guardians can expect the following process to be followed:
 - An Associate Principal will call families with the next steps.
 - The student's counselor will email all of the teachers and include the student & parent(s)/guardian(s) on the email to indicate the length of absence. This email is to ensure that all parties have each other's contact information to help the student continue to engage in school remotely.
 - Students will be required to complete a daily check-in form emailed each day of quarantine from Ms. Cates. Ms. Cates will help to facilitate any communication and/or connections that students may need with their teachers. If a student does not complete the form for two consecutive school days, someone from Wilmot Union High School will reach out to help problem-solve.
 - Students will need to check the Google Classroom assigned to each of their courses on a daily basis for updates, assignments, and class resources. They should contact the teacher directly with specific questions. For information on Google classroom and setting up a guardian summary click <u>HERE</u>.
 - Students who are returning from quarantine may be entered into a guided study hall. When their make-up work from quarantine is complete, they will return to their regular study hall.
