

MARCH 4, 2022 GENERAL UPDATES/REMINDERS:

- Administrative Update: District Leader Amber Torres recently submitted her notice to the board of her intent to resign at the end of the 2021-2022 school year. The board is grateful for Mrs. Torres' many positive contributions to the district over her 5-year tenure as an administrator. Director of Special Education and Human Resources Jon Watson also submitted his notice of intent to resign from his position at the end of the 2021-2022 school year. The board thanks Mr. Watson for the good work he has done in the district over the past 8 years as both a teacher and an administrator. These positions will not be filled as the district is restructuring administrative roles. The board wishes each of them good luck in their future endeavors.
- Superintendent Search: Our search for a superintendent is progressing nicely. Several experienced and skilled candidates have applied for the position. As you may know, the consultants from McPherson & Jacobson conducted stakeholder input sessions that will guide the Board in the process. - Family Advisory Committee: Wilmot Union High School values and encourages the support of the family to ensure student success. It is a team effort. Meetings are open to all parents/guardians of current Wilmot students and parents/guardians of 8th graders joining us as freshmen in the fall. We will meet once a month. Regular attendance is not required. Show up when the date and time work for you. We plan on rotating the day of the week to ensure more opportunities for participation. We will be sure to announce the topic of discussion ahead of the meeting and remind everyone of the date and time in advance. - Face Covering Update: Please note that our face-covering protocols have been updated to align with the latest CDC guidance. <u>At this time, face coverings are recommended but not required on school buses or district-operated vehicles.</u>
- Juniors-Only ACT Day: Wilmot Union High School will be administering the ACT plus Writing examination on March 8, 2022. This test is state-mandated for all 11th-grade students.
 - The school day for Juniors on March 8 will run from 7:30 am until 12:15 pm with our doors opening at 7:00 am. Please bring your charged Chromebook.
 - Morning buses will pick up at the normal time. The afternoon bus will depart at 12:40 pm. <u>The afternoon routes are consolidated and students may have a longer walk home.</u>
 - A light breakfast will be provided in the commons starting at 7:00 am, and a grab-and-go lunch will be available after testing.
 - Attendance of Juniors on March 8th is essential.
 - There is no school for 9th, 10th, or 12th-grade students on this day.

Please note that any Juniors with ACT accommodations WILL NOT have the same testing timeframe as stated above. They will need to report on March 8th to begin testing at 7:30 am, but they will test later than 12:15 pm. You will receive a mailing that includes your student's specific schedule according to their accommodations. - **Summer School:** Current students interested in taking summer school courses should turn their forms into the Student Services Office as soon as possible. Forms can be picked up from Mrs. Fiveland-Scott in the Student Services Office.

ACADEMICS:

- 22-23 Course Selection is complete: Every student has had the opportunity to meet individually with their school counselor to discuss their course selection for next year. Each student was given a reminder about the June 1, 2022 deadline to make changes to these courses. You can see your student's course selection in Skyward under "Schedule," then "Course Requests." As always, if you have any questions, please reach out to your student's school counselor.
- Quarantined Students: If a student is quarantined this year, parents/guardians can expect the following process to be followed:
 - An Associate Principal will call families with the next steps.
 - The student's counselor will email all of the teachers and include the student & parent(s)/guardian(s) on the email to indicate the length of absence. This email is to ensure that all parties have each other's contact information to help the student continue to engage in school remotely.
 - Students will be required to complete a daily check-in form emailed each day of quarantine from Ms. Cates. Ms. Cates will help to facilitate any communication and/or connections that students may need with their teachers. If a student does not complete the form for two consecutive school days, someone from Wilmot Union High School will reach out to help problem-solve.
 - Students will need to check the Google Classroom assigned to each of their courses on a
 daily basis for updates, assignments, and class resources. They should contact the
 teacher directly with specific questions. For information on Google classroom and

 - Students who are returning from quarantine may be entered into a guided study hall.
 When their make-up work from quarantine is complete, they will return to their regular study hall.


Upcoming Visits:
