GENERAL UPDATES/REMINDERS:

- No School: There will be no school on Friday, April 15 or Monday, April 18, 2022. All offices will be closed. Normal office hours will resume on Tuesday, April 19, 2022.
- New Superintendent Meet & Greet: Join us on Monday, April 25, 2022, from 5:00pm 6:00pm in the Wilmot Union High School Library to welcome our new Superintendent, Dr. Michael Plourde! There will be a Board of Education Meeting in the library immediately following the meet & greet with Dr. Plourde.
- Speak Up, Speak Out: This week, students were introduced to Speak Up, Speak Out (SUSO). Created by the Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) Office of School Safety (OSS), the SPEAK UP, SPEAK OUT Resource Center is a comprehensive, one-stop place to turn with important concerns. Speak Up, Speak Out allows students and family members to share concerns about more than just school threats. Students can share information about self-harm, bullying and harassment, and drug and alcohol use to promote a safe environment for all. You can submit a school safety concern by downloading the SUSO app (Android and iOS), visiting speakup.widoj.gov, or by calling 1-800-MY-SUSO-1. Resource Center staff work around-the-clock to respond to reports and to deploy a response locally by communicating directly with school administrators, law enforcement, and counselors. The SUSO threat reporting system aims to empower students to share their concerns safely and confidentially without fear of retaliation. We encourage you to talk to your students about the importance of letting a trusted adult know about their safety concerns. Learn more about Speak Up, Speak Out HERE.
- Upcoming Surveys: We are conducting a survey of Wilmot staff, families, and students to assess district climate and culture. We intend to use this survey as a baseline to better understand your priorities as we move forward with our District's Strategic Plan. We have hired School Perceptions, an independent educational research firm, to assist with the survey administration and analysis process. We are asking that all staff, families, and students respond to this survey that will be sent out from the District next week. - ACT Aspire Information: The ACT Aspire Testing for all freshmen and sophomores is scheduled for Wednesday and Thursday, April 20 and 21. The purpose of the ACT Aspire assessment is to measure student achievement and progress toward college and career readiness. For most freshmen and sophomore students, testing will occur from 7:35am -11:00am. Students with accommodations will be contacted by their case managers with specifics.
- AP Test Information: Important AP test information has been posted on Skyward Family and Student Access and emailed to parents and students. Please check both on a regular basis so that you have all of the information necessary in order to participate in AP testing this year.
