GENERAL UPDATES/REMINDERS:

- A Message from our District Administrator Dr. Michael Plourde
 - ***Attention***
 - Wilmot Union High School will have an operational referendum question on the ballot for the April 4th election. Please visit our <u>website</u> for more information including Referendum FAQs, Tax Impact Calculator, and Find My Polling Place. Feel welcome to come to Dr. Plourde with any questions.
 - Due to several inclement weather days this winter, we have had to make adjustments to our calendar to ensure we meet the state-mandated number of instructional hours.
 Please make note of the following changes:
 - Tuesday, March 7th will be a full school day for all students. The schedule will be unique, as juniors will be taking the ACT test in a separate area of the building. Students, please listen to your teachers to ensure you know where to go that day.
 - Monday, April 10th will be a full school day.
 - March 14th, April 11th, April 25th, May 9th, and May 23rd will be full school days instead of late starts.
- A Message from our Principal Rob Kreil:
 - On Tuesday, March 7, 2023, Wilmot Union High School will be administering the Online
 ACT plus Writing. This test is state-mandated for all 11th grade students. On February
 22 and 23 during WARP, we will complete pre-administration activities in preparation for
 this statewide test.
 - Students will need their school issued Chromebook for the pre-administration activities and to complete the ACT Test. Please remember to have the Chromebook fully charged.

 - Attendance of Juniors on March 7 is essential.
 - Due to the inclement weather, please remember that this is an ALL STUDENT DAY.

- KENOSHA COUNTY ROAD CLOSURE *UPDATE*: Kenosha County's spring 2023 culvert
 rehabilitation project is underway, causing lane closures and limited full closures on several
 roadways across the county. As such, the Kenosha County Division of Highways would like to
 inform our school districts of these projects, as they may involve detours or traffic delays on
 some of your bus routes.
 - The full closure of Highway C (Wilmot Road) just east of Highway W (Fox River Road) that was scheduled to occur this Friday and Saturday, March 3 and 4, has been postponed due to anticipated weather conditions. This closure is now scheduled to occur from approximately 10 a.m. Monday, March 6, until 10 a.m. Tuesday, March 7.





- If weather conditions on Monday do not permit this work, the closure will be moved to 10 a.m. Tuesday, March 7, until 10 a.m. Wednesday, March 8.
- The closure is being staged to allow for final restoration of the highway surface where a culvert was recently replaced. A posted detour will route drivers around the closure via Highway W, Highway F (93rd Street/Silver Lake Road), and Highway B (296th Avenue/Tuttle Road)

- The culvert replacement locations and projected times are as follows:
 - Highway C (Wilmot Road) between Highway W (Fox River Road) and Highway B (304th Avenue):
 - One-lane closure with automated flagging operations in place during the week of Feb. 6
 - Anticipated completion and full reopening on Tuesday, Feb. 14
 - Full highway closure scheduled for Highway surface restoration work on March 27 and 28 (school spring break period)
 - Highway K (60th Street) near 241st Court:
 - Full highway closure in the 24100 block of Highway K began Monday, Feb. 6
 - Anticipated reopening at 6 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 10
 - Marked detour in place
 - Highway D (172nd Avenue) south of Highway A (Seventh Street):
 - Full highway closure to begin Monday, Feb. 13
 - Marked detour route to be in place
 - Anticipated reopening late afternoon Friday, Feb. 17
 - Highway C (Wilmot Road) west of 286th Avenue:
 - Full highway closure to begin Wednesday, Feb. 15
 - Marked detour route to be in place
 - Anticipated reopening on Thursday, Feb. 23
 - Highway Y (22nd Avenue) near 14th Place:
 - Full highway closure now scheduled to begin Monday, Feb. 20
 - Marked detour route to be in place
 - Reopening anticipated on or before Friday, Mar 3, 2023

- **Summer School:** Current students interested in taking summer school courses can pick up a form in Student Services **starting on Monday, February 13th**. Forms can be picked up from Mr. Slawson.
- Course Selection: 9th-11th grade students have begun the 2023-2024 school year course selection process. We encourage you to talk with your students about this process and their selections. Students will meet individually with their counselors to confirm their course selections. Students will have until June 1st to let their counselor know of any schedule change requests for the 23-24 school year.

- Work-Based Learning: Sophomores and Juniors did you know that you can receive 0.5 up to 2.0 credits for work experience through a single semester, a full year, or up to two years? You may also be able to include summer work hours for credit if scheduled soon enough.

- FAFSA Completion Help: The Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions' Office of Financial Capability announces the following new opportunity. As part of the Wisconsin Coalition on Student Debt's equitable recovery grant, Fair Opportunity Project has launched a 1:1 FAFSA help service statewide Students can sign up for a 45 minute virtual session with a trained FAFSA completion coach through this link:

- Counselors will be notified when students sign up so that we can keep them informed about the services their students are receiving and whether the student has successfully filed their FAFSA.
- Background on the Program: We have assistance in Spanish, Bengali and Hindi as well as English. Students can also access mentoring, scholarship help, and free essay reviews by signing up.
- Volunteers were recruited from Grant Thornton, one of the nation's largest CPA firms. Hence, these volunteers have strong financial training. We have 13 volunteers and approximately 20 hours of session times per week.
- Volunteers completed a student confidentiality form and went through a 1 hour training with Mike Gawel. We are asking students to sign up with the Fair Opportunity Project using the Going Merry FAFSA tool so that we can follow up with students who don't submit the form or who may want follow-up contact for essay review, mentoring, or scholarship opportunities.
- We compiled this training packet for volunteers, complete with follow-up instructions on documenting the session so that we know the status of the FAFSA effort.
- We coordinate the scheduling and the meeting links and provide this checklist to students so that they know what to have ready for their session.
- We also notify the school counselor that the student has signed up for and then attended the session. Following the session, we send out a survey to the student.
 - We added incentives to create more buzz.
 - Students who complete their FAFSAs between December 1, 2022-April 15, 2023 will be entered into a drawing to:
 - Win one of 5 iPads (9th gen, \$329 value);
 - Win one of 15 sets of Milwaukee Brewers or Bucks tickets;
 - Win one of 2 \$100 Edvest 529 college savings gift cards.
 - Win one of 5 \$1,000 scholarships for college
 - PLUS: The Wisconsin high school with the largest FAFSA completion percentage increase from last year (ending June 30, 2022) to this year's cycle (as of April 15, 2023) will win \$5,000 in education-related supplies and materials and an all-school pizza party in May.
