ACADEMICS:

• PSAT/NMSQT Test Registration:

- <u>Please see the below information regarding the optional PSAT/NMSOT</u> <u>test:</u>
- Students in the class of 2025 have the option to take the 2023 PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) this fall. The PSAT/NMSQT measures critical thinking skills that are important for success in college, including critical reading, math problem-solving, and writing skills. The 2023 PSAT/NMSQT is also the qualifying test students must take to enter National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) competitions for college scholarships that will be awarded in 2025.
- The PSAT Test is typically taken by students:
 - Who are planning on taking the SAT test



- Score very high on standardized tests
- Have a parent that is employed by a company that takes part in the NMSC
- The test will be administered at Wilmot Union High School on Tuesday, October 10, 2023, at 7:30 a.m. This is a late start Tuesday. The test is approximately 3 hours in length and is a digital test. Students will need to bring their fully charged Chromebook. There is an \$18.00 fee to take the test which is payable by cash, credit card via Skyward or by check. Checks should be made payable to Wilmot Union High School.
- To register for the 2023 PSAT/NMSQT test please complete **this form** and submit your \$18.00 payment through one of the options listed on the form by June 9, 2023.
- If you are not sure if your student should take the PSAT, please discuss it with your school counselor.
