- Kenosha County Broadband Survey: Increasingly, Kenosha County residents' daily lives are occurring online for work, school and entertainment. This trend was accelerated by the COVID-19 pandemic, putting more pressure on our broadband infrastructure. From now until the end of the year, Kenosha County residents have a unique opportunity to help ensure we have fast, affordable internet access for all just by taking a brief <u>speed test</u> online. The test takes less than a minute to complete and collects information on how fast data can be downloaded and uploaded with the internet connection used to run the test. The data gathered from the test will be shared with local, state and federal governments, granting agencies and internet service providers in an effort to improve the quality of internet services in Kenosha County.

- Each year the Wisconsin Professional Police Association (WPPA) awards scholarships to Wisconsin students enrolling in a course of study leading to a degree in police science or criminal justice. All scholarships are awarded without regard to sex, race, cultural background, or religious preference. Financial need is not a criterion for selection in this scholarship program.

STUDENT SERVICES:

- **Grade Adjustment Deadline:** Current students who received pass/no pass grades during the spring of 2020 have the opportunity to request their transcript be adjusted to include the traditional letter grades they earned. For this reason, we are asking our current Seniors and qualified Sophomores and Juniors who are interested to set an appointment with their respective counselor to go over their options regarding a grade adjustment.
 - **The deadline to request the grade adjustment is January 19, 2023.** Grades from the spring of 2020 semester will not be factored into the laude system calculation for students, and adjustments must be for all classes. Students who choose not to opt in will retain the pass/no pass grades assigned to them.
 - Additionally, Students who are under 18 years of age will have to submit a signed permission form to request the grade adjustment. Please reach out to your counselor with any questions.

- **ASVAB:** Wilmot Union High School will be proctoring the ASVAB test to students on Tuesday, February 7th, from 7:30-10:30 a.m. **This is a late start Tuesday.**
 - The ASVAB is a multiple-aptitude battery that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military.
 - If your student would like to take the ASVAB test, please have them complete the ASVAB Registration form that was emailed to them by **Tuesday, January 31st.**
- ACT Prep Class: The next ACT Prep class will be starting in January. This class prepares students for the Statewide ACT test on March 7, 2023, which all Juniors are required to take. Classes start on Monday, January 16th, and the cost is \$175. For more information regarding the structure of the class please visit Wisconsin Test Prep.

- **FAFSA Completion Help:** The Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions' Office of Financial Capability announces the following new opportunity. As part of the Wisconsin Coalition on Student Debt's equitable recovery grant, Fair Opportunity Project has launched a 1:1 FAFSA help



service statewide Students can sign up for a 45 minute virtual session with a trained FAFSA completion coach through this link:

- Counselors will be notified when students sign up so that we can keep them informed about the services their students are receiving and whether the student has successfully filed their FAFSA.
- Background on the Program: We have assistance in Spanish, Bengali and Hindi as well as English. Students can also access mentoring, scholarship help, and free essay reviews by signing up.
- Volunteers were recruited from Grant Thornton, one of the nation's largest CPA firms.
 Hence, these volunteers have strong financial training. We have 13 volunteers and approximately 20 hours of session times per week.
- Volunteers completed a student confidentiality form and went through a 1 hour training with Mike Gawel. We are asking students to sign up with the Fair Opportunity Project using the Going Merry FAFSA tool so that we can follow up with students who don't submit the form or who may want follow-up contact for essay review, mentoring, or scholarship opportunities.
- We compiled this <u>training packet</u> for volunteers, complete with follow-up instructions on documenting the session so that we know the status of the FAFSA effort.
- We coordinate the scheduling and the meeting links and provide this <u>checklist</u> to students so that they know what to have ready for their session.
- We also notify the school counselor that the student has signed up for and then attended the session. Following the session, we send out a survey to the student.
 - We added incentives to create more buzz.
 - Students who complete their FAFSAs between December 1, 2022-April 15, 2023 will be entered into a drawing to:
 - Win one of 5 iPads (9th gen, \$329 value);
 - Win one of 15 sets of Milwaukee Brewers or Bucks tickets;
 - Win one of 2 \$100 Edvest 529 college savings gift cards.
 - Win one of 5 \$1,000 scholarships for college
 - PLUS: The Wisconsin high school with the largest FAFSA completion percentage increase from last year (ending June 30, 2022) to this year's cycle (as of April 15, 2023) will win \$5,000 in education-related supplies and materials and an all-school pizza party in May.
- Junior Conference: Starting in November, all junior students will have the opportunity to attend a Junior Conference with their school counselor. Topics that we will be discussing will include graduation requirements, current and future plans, career plans and areas of interest, college campus visits, scholarships and financial aid and any questions or concerns you or your student may have.
