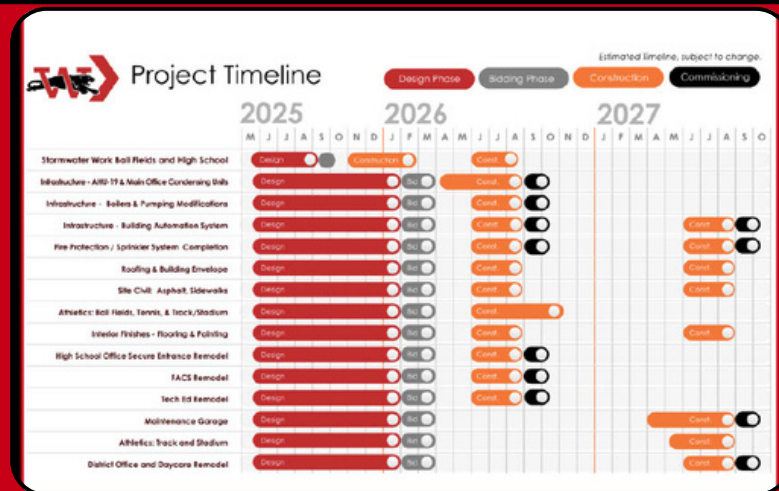

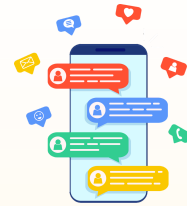

# Maintaining Trevor-Wilmot School: A Community Decision

The Trevor-Wilmot Consolidated Grade School District is seeking voter approval of a 4-year non-recurring operating referendum on the April 7th election ballot.

## Why Seek a Referendum?

### Unreliable State Funding

Despite years of cutting costs, shared services, and responsible budgeting, Trevor-Wilmot continues to face a growing gap between state funding and what it costs to operate our school.

Revenue limits on WI schools have not kept pace with inflation.

Utilities, benefits, transportation, and building maintenance costs continue to rise.

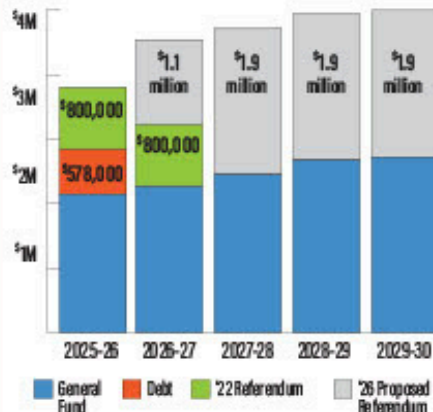
State aid does not fully cover the cost of mandated services, such as Special Education.

### Local Funding is Set to Expire

Next year, Trevor-Wilmot will lose \$1.4 million in existing referendum funding which expires in 2027.

The proposed referendum replaces this expiring funding with updated amounts needed to maintain educational programming and day-to-day operations.

Proposed District Tax Levy: This chart shows existing referendum funding and debt payments ending and being replaced by the proposed operational referendum.



### Maintaining Programs & Services

This referendum would provide stable, predictable funding for four years and would allow the district to maintain the current levels of educational programs and services that Trevor-Wilmot families rely on.

# Operating Referendum FAQs

## What is on the Ballot?

On April 7<sup>th</sup>, voters will see a ballot question asking whether the Trevor-Wilmot Consolidated Grade School District should be allowed to exceed Wisconsin's revenue limit for temporary, non-recurring operational purposes including maintaining educational programming, safety, and facilities.

## What is the Tax Impact?

The School Board has made efforts to keep the estimated mill rate increase low, while protecting current educational programs and services.

An approved referendum gives the board approval to temporarily exceed the revenue limit. It is estimated to increase the mill rate by \$0.83 compared to the 2025-26 mill rate of \$5.16. The mill rate represents the property tax rate per \$1,000 of equalized property value.

## What has been done so far?

### Cut Expenses

- Spending held flat despite inflation (6 years)
- Reduction in staff (admin and office/support staff)
- Right-sized classes to align with enrollment
- Adjusted insurance plans
- Delayed maintenance

### Shared Services

We have several shared service agreements with neighboring school districts. This has helped to reduce costs yet ensure students continue receiving high-quality, specialized support.

### Early Debt Pay-off

After the 2025-26 school year, the District will have completed all debt payments from the 2011 consolidation. Through responsible budgeting and pre-paying debt, the district saved the taxpayers nearly \$400,000 in interest costs.

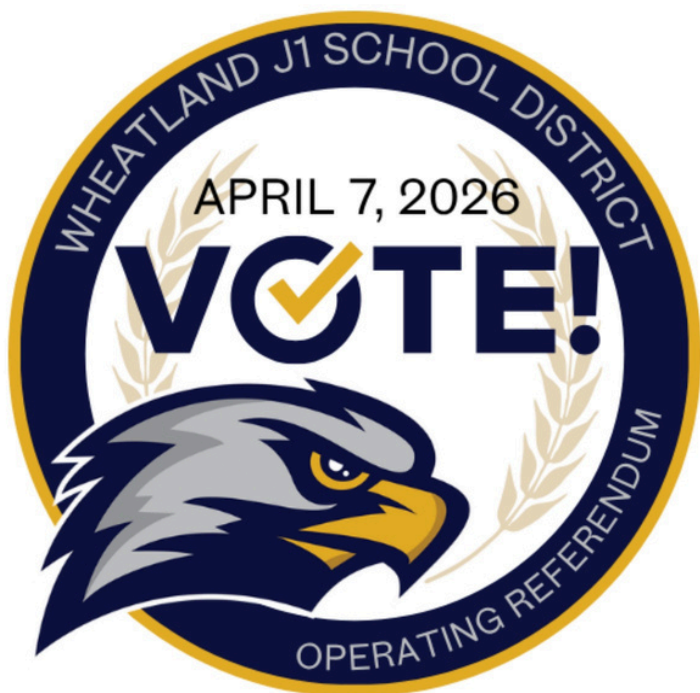

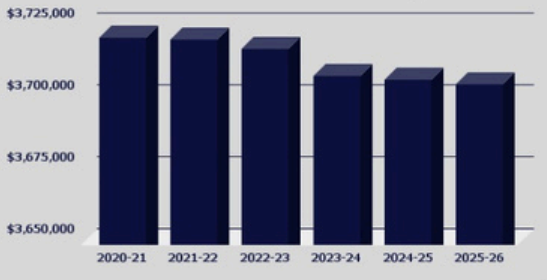

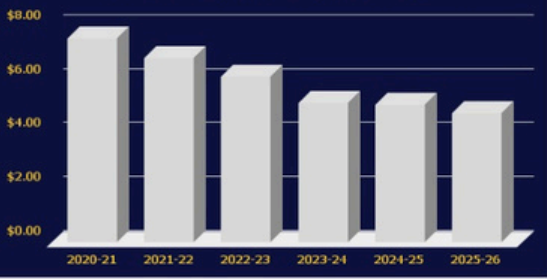
## WHEATLAND REFERENDUM RENEWAL

Last fall, the Wheatland J1 School Board approved a renewal of the current operating referendum to appear on the April 2026 ballot. The District is asking for \$400,000 for each of the next 4 years, which is a reduction of \$125,000 per year. This represents a total decrease of \$500,000 from the previous 4 year total. Due to the current school funding model, the referendum is still needed to continue to operate the school district at current levels. As a result of Wheatland's sustained success and continued growth, the proposed referendum will have **no additional tax impact** on local property owners.

## SINCE 2022, THE DISTRICT HAS...

- Increased student achievement/growth in all measurable areas
- Scored in the upper portion of the Exceeds Expectations category on every state report card
- Tripled Community Education programming and participation
- Decreased the school tax levy in all 4 years of the last referendum
- Reduced the mill rate from 6.84 to 4.80 in 4 years
- Initiated additional contributions to fund 39 for future debt management (Will be paying off an additional 3.5 years of debt in March when the debt is callable, saving \$750,000 in interest)
- Continued funding the Capital Projects Fund (Fund 46) to accommodate future facilities needs and maintain district assets
- Deliberately optimized revenue generated through open enrollment to maintain and expand programming for all students

## A HISTORY OF DECISIONS YOU CAN COUNT ON

When the Board asked the community to approve the last operating referendum, they committed to be good financial stewards and only use the levy authority needed. They have fulfilled that promise. They have continued to reduce the overall school tax levy and the mill rate has dropped even more sharply. The Board was able to keep the tax levy flat or reduce it slightly in all four years of the current operating referendum. Other area districts have been forced to increase taxes and expand current referendums. Wheatland has been able to keep its commitment to local taxpayer payers, and has found ways to increase student options, while holding the line on taxes.





# APRIL 7<sup>TH</sup> REFERENDUM

## TWIN LAKES #4 SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Twin Lakes #4 School District will be asking the community to vote on an operating referendum on April 7, 2026.

The referendum will allow the district to **maintain current operations**, including the flexibility to add up to (3) teaching positions over the course of 4-years as needed, to support academic success and social-emotional needs of students.

### OPTIMIZATION ACTIONS TAKEN BY THE DISTRICT IN 2024-2025

Prior to making the decision to go to referendum, the District thoroughly reviewed the budget and took the following actions:



#### BUDGETING

- Reduced planned deficit from \$900,000 to \$275,000



#### MAXIMIZED OPERATIONAL AND EFFICIENCIES

- Administrative partnership with Randall School District
- Review and restructure of Operational responsibilities and shared services
- Reduced 11 teaching & administrative positions



#### RESPONSIBLE FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

- Paid off previous capital referendum early, reducing interest paid by the community
- Continued to reduce the Mill Rate/District Taxes by 55.3% over the last 10 years

## BACKGROUND

Declining enrollment is a challenge faced by Districts across Wisconsin. Decreasing enrollment combined with a State funding formula that does not adequately cover District operational costs has required the District to utilize their fund balance to offset the funding deficit over the past several years. The fund balance is unable to sustain this long-term, and we are seeking community support to continue funding District Operations.

- 1. ACADEMIC SUCCESS & WELLBEING OF STUDENTS**
