DEAR WUHS COMMUNITY,

All of the major decisions we make at Wilmot Union High School are driven by our mission: *Preparing college, career, and civic ready graduates*. To best align the district's goals and resources, a strategic plan was developed in the Spring of 2021. The Strategic Planning Committee was comprised of school board members, administrators, teachers, support staff, parents, and students. This school year is the third of a five year cycle.

The Strategic Planning Committee developed five objectives and a sixth was added this year to address facilities and grounds needs. They are:

- Objective #1: Develop a comprehensive academic and career planning system focused on student engagement, exploration, and growth
- Objective #2: Align professional learning community practices and assessments to measure student learning based on standards
- Objective #3: Initiate and foster meaningful, trusting relationships and intentional involvement with families and the community
- Objective #4: Promote a positive school culture through collaboration, professional development, and high expectations matched with high support
- Objective #5: Create a sustainable and proactive operational plan that fosters growth and allows for flexibility as needs evolve
- Objective #6: Strategically develop, enhance, and optimize facilities and grounds to provide a safe, efficient, and aesthetically appealing environment

Each objective includes three to six action steps which outline the major work of district leaders throughout the year. Reports of progress are made to the board periodically at regular board meetings. These truly are things we are doing to improve WUHS and not just a plan on a shelf. In fact, we don't even keep the strategic plan in a binder!

NURSE NOTES, ELIZABETH REBOLLAR WHEN TO KEEP YOUR CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL?

- Fever (students should be fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications before returning to school)
- Diarrhea (Children can return to school when they have not had diarrhea for 24 hours)
- Vomiting (Children can return to school after vomiting when they can tolerate liquids and solid foods)
- COVID-19 (If you test positive for COVID-19, stay home for at least 5 days and isolate yourself from others in your home)

Check out the isolation and exposure calculator on the CDC webpage for additional isolation instructions.

Stay healthy this fall by washing your hands often especially:

- Before handling/preparing food, after eating food
- After using the restroom
- · After touching an animal, feeding an animal or dealing with animal waste
- Before and after treating a cut or a wound
- After blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing
