Did You Know?



Starting in Kindergarten, students should miss no more than 9 days of school per year to stay on track for graduation. **That means missing no more than one day per month!**

ACT/PreACT Practice Day – Get Ready to Show What You Know!

Seniors Hit the Road – College Visit

Freshmen, Sophomores & Juniors – PreACT & ACT Practice Day

On Tuesday, September 16, students in grades 9–11 will take part in a valuable college readiness experience:

- **9th & 10th graders** will take the **PreACT**, a shorter version of the ACT that gives early insight into strengths, areas for improvement, and possible career paths.
- **11th graders** will take a **full-length practice ACT** under timed, test-like conditions—just like the real thing they'll take in spring.

These assessments help students:

- ✓ Practice test-taking strategies
- ✓ Understand what to expect on the real ACT
- ✓ Receive feedback on academic strengths and needs
- ✓ Explore career pathways through interest results

Testing Schedule:

Testing runs from **7:45 AM to approximately 11:25 AM**.

After testing, students will participate in a variety of fun and meaningful activities for the remainder of the day.


What to Bring:

- Chromebook (fully charged)
- Calculator
- Pencils
- Book or quiet activity for after testing

Seniors – College Visit Day

While underclassmen are testing, seniors will have the opportunity to explore life after high school. Students can:

- ✓ **Visit a college of their choice independently**
- ✓ **Join a school-led trip** to either **UW-Whitewater** or **Gateway Technical College – Kenosha Campus**

ANNUAL NOTICE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION REFERRAL AND EVALUATION PROCEDURES

Upon request, the Wilmot Union School District is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluates all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. A MESSAGE FROM STUDENT SERVICES

Start College Now & Early College Credit Information

Start College Now (SCN) is a statewide program that allows eligible high school juniors and seniors to take Technical College courses and earn college and high school credit. Each year, applications for the **spring semester** are due no later than **October 1st**. Applications for the **fall semester** are due no later than **March 1**.

Early College Credit (ECC) is a statewide program that allows eligible high school juniors and seniors to take courses through WI four-year public and private colleges and earn high school and college credit. Application deadlines are the same as the SCN program.

If a student is interested in earning college credits through SCN or ECCP in Spring 2026, **NOW** is the time to reach out to their School Counselor to get an application. The deadline for completed forms is 3:00pm on October 1, 2025.
