## Virtual Learning FAQ

### What is a Virtual Learning Day?

During school closure, Virtual Learning Days are days in which students will complete their instructional coursework at home in lieu of attending school. Students will need to utilize their school emails in order to communicate and connect with the virtual classrooms designed by their teachers. If you are using a home device, please use Google Chrome to log into your student's account.

### How will Wilmot Union High School teachers deliver instruction during Virtual Learning Days?

Most of our teachers will be utilizing Google Classroom as a virtual learning application. Our Physical Education and Business Information Technology departments are well versed in Schoology and will continue to use that application. Each teacher will contact students via email with specific information about joining their class virtually.

### What if my student does not have a device or connectivity?

If you need a device to take part in virtual learning, please report to the high school on Tuesday, March 17 between the hours of 8:00 am and 3:00 pm. Please try to have your student ID on you. If you do not have your student ID, you must know your student ID number.

We are currently working to contact Spectrum and learn more about the internet access options that will be available to our community. We will share more information about this as it becomes available.

### What will the daily schedule be?

Virtual Learning will begin on Wednesday, March 18, 2020. \*Please note there will be no Virtual Learning Days during our previously scheduled Spring Break (March 23-March 27). \* Virtual Learning will resume on Monday, March 30, 2020.

Virtual Learning Days will focus on the essential information that students will need to ensure the continuation of learning. Teachers will be creating approximately 30-45 minute lessons per class. The 30-45 minute lessons may include activities, reading, videos, writing, formative assessments, and/or discussions, etc.

Students should plan approximately 3 hours total per day of engagement in the learning tasks. Teacher prep time is 7:35am-9:00am. Tasks will be posted by 9:00 am daily and will follow the schedule below:

#### Even Days of the Month

6th hour  
8th hour

#### Odd Days of the Month

1st hour  
3rd hour  
5th hour  
7th hour

## Student Workflow and Academic Support

For each course on the assigned days, students are expected to:

1. Go into their assigned class' Google Classroom/Schoology Classroom
2. Read through the information posted by the teacher
3. Complete the learning tasks as instructed by the teacher
4. Repeat 1-3 for each course assigned following the schedule above.

Teachers will be posting specific hours that they will be available through their virtual applications or via email. Teachers and school counselors will have availability throughout the hours of 7:35am-2:30pm for email responses. Please be patient with teachers/counselors as they respond. Sometimes questions require more time to respond to, or teachers may be working with another student at the time of receiving the email.

## Students with IEP/504 Services

During this time of shutdown, students are going to receive to the greatest extent possible the services they need to continue their education. Special Education teachers and other Pupil Services staff will be available to work with students via phone, email, and zoom. Your Special Education Case Manager will work with each of their students to plan for needs and Susan Fennell is available for any 504 students or parents who have questions about need.

Special Education teachers are still partnering in their Co-Taught classes to make sure that students are receiving the support and differentiated instruction that they need.

## Food Service

A drive-thru/grab and go breakfast and lunch will be available from 11am-1pm at four locations for Wilmot students with a student ID:

This will be available Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays starting 3/17/2020. This service will not be available over our regularly scheduled spring break.

## What if I have more questions?

The best option would be to start specifically with the teacher of the class in which you have the question. If the question extends beyond the classroom teacher, all counselors and administration will be available to families during this time.
