OUR COMMITMENTS

SAFETY

Taking into consideration the mental and physical health of our students and our employees, the district will apply appropriate safety measures based on guidance from the State and County Health Departments.

STUDENT SUCCESS

In-person learning and teaching with appropriate safety measures is the preferred form of instruction. Educational plans will include a hybrid and virtual format in the event that in-person learning cannot occur.

ADAPTABILITY

Educators, families, and the community must be prepared to adapt to evolving conditions of the educational setting.



PHYSICAL SPACES

Implementation of guidelines based on Center for Disease Control and Kenosha County Health Department guidance

Physical Barriers

Plexiglass in public offices and points of service

Increased sanitation stations

CLEANING & SANITATION

- Use of hand sanitizer
- Increased frequency of disinfecting high-contact surfaces. Disinfecting will occur multiple times throughout the day
- Atomizer for sanitation use during closed school hours nightly
- Install more “touch-free” devices in bathrooms and the building such as soap dispensers, paper towel dispensers, etc.
- Maximize airflow throughout the building



DAILY OPERATIONS

- Limit visitors to essential individuals
- Regulate directional flow of entrances and some passageways
- Field trips are canceled until further notice

- Regular communications with updates and modifications
- **Use of face coverings will be mandatory in the building**



TRANSPORTATION

- Survey families about utilizing School Transportation
- Dousman Transportation will monitor their staff for symptoms and enforce good hygiene habits
- Staff and students expected to wear face coverings on all bus routes
- Disinfect buses after morning and evening routes
- Open windows during bus routes when realistic
- Students will be seated from the back of the bus to the front and will get off the bus in the opposite manner
- Encouraging self transport
- All self transport students enter door N and door G



THREE INSTRUCTIONAL MODELS

Throughout the year, we expect to shift between these three instructional models.

- **In-Person**- Face to Face, all students present in classrooms, 5 days a week
- **4 & 1**- Face to Face, all students present in classrooms, 4 days a week & virtual one day a week
- **Virtual** - All students learning off campus in a virtual or distance setting



4 & 1 INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL

A schedule that offers in-person instruction 4 days/week and virtual learning 1 day/week.

VIRTUAL CHOICE INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL

- **Families may opt to choose a fully virtual setting for their student(s).**
 - This model would incorporate the Apex program which has a large variety of courses to help individualize to the credits that each student would need.
 - Parents/guardians will need to contact their student's counselor to begin this request.
 - Actual program planning will be determined by the Student Services Team based on the student's needs.
 - This would be a minimum semester-long commitment in order to ensure consistency for the student.

SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL SUPPORT

- Social and Emotional supports will be available to all students throughout the year despite the instructional model in place.
- The Student Services Team (SST) will meet regularly to plan for individual student needs.
- Support will be provided to students in the following manners:
 - Homeroom Intervention
 - Counselor Support (individual and/or group)
 - School Social Worker
 - School Psychologist
 - Referral to outside agency (Professional Services Group)



EXTRACURRICULAR-ATHLETICS AND ACTIVITIES

Goals:

- Return to safe play in supervised and organized activities.
- Coordinate with established guidelines from Kenosha County Health Department, the National Federation of High School Sports (NFHS), the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA), the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the Department of Health Services (DHS).

Participation in athletics and activities is voluntary.

- Families should make decisions about student participation based on their individual health and safety needs.
- Participants should communicate their needs to their coaches and advisors.



EXTRACURRICULAR-ATHLETICS

Safety Measures

- Athletes and staff will not participate if they exhibit symptoms associated with COVID-19. There is no penalty for medical-related non-participation.
- All personal clothing and equipment must be taken home daily for cleaning and disinfecting.
- Student-athletes will provide their own water for hydration. Communal water stations will not be available.
- Handwashing prior to, during, and after practices is strongly encouraged.
- Face masks or face shields may be required in certain settings

Spectator Participation

- Limited spectators - The Southern Lakes Athletic Directors and District Administrators have set the following guidelines: 4 guests/student athlete for outdoor events, and 2 guests per student athlete for indoor events. Associate Principals will monitor the student section home and away.
- Self-transportation optional to reduce bus capacity.



EVENTS

- Concerts (Band/Choir) will allow for 2 guests to watch in person, other guests may watch streamed or recorded.
- Theatrical Productions will allow for 2 guests to watch in person, other guests may watch streamed or recorded.
- Athletic Contests: **Indoor**: will allow for 2 guests in person, other guests may watch streamed or recorded. **Outdoor**: will allow for 4 guests in person, other guests may watch streamed or recorded, with exception of tennis, golf, and cross country.
- Tickets: students will be given passes prior to events to give to guests. No tickets at the door.
- If additional seating is available based on seating capacity recommendations, there will be a lottery system available to students for the remaining tickets.
- Guests will be required to wear face coverings at indoor events.

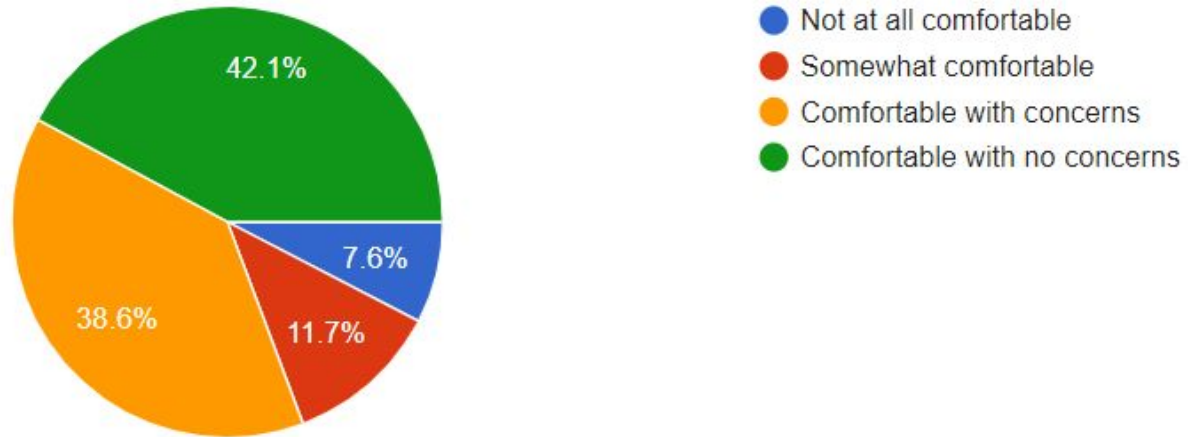


SURVEY RESULTS - FAMILIES

June 26, 2020

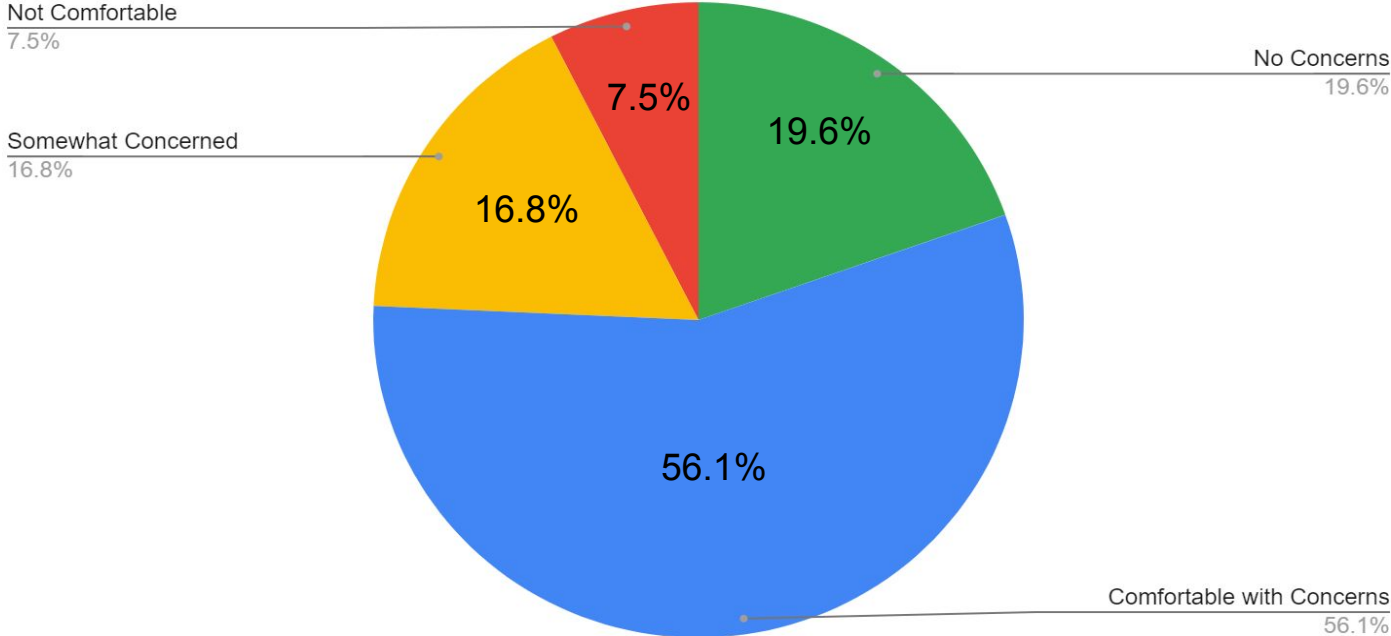
If public health officials believe it is safe to allow in-person instruction, would you be comfortable having your student return to school this fall?
